

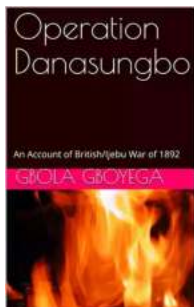
An Account of the British/Ijebu War of 1892:

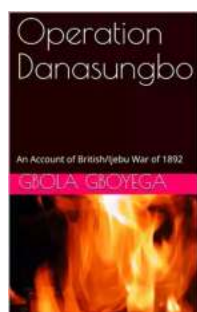
